Who Can Apply

The Michigan Life Sciences Fellows program seeks applicants with broad intellectual interests in the biological sciences and a keen desire to pursue a career in research. Applicants must be graduate students in their final year of schooling, or graduates who are less than one year post-degree (Ph.D., M.D., Pharm.D., M.D./Ph.D., or Pharm.D./Ph.D.) at the time of application.
